6. Local Information

Bangkok welcomes more visitors than any other city in the world and it doesn't take long to realize why. Bangkok is a city of contrasts with action at every turn. Marvel at the gleaming temples, catch a tuk tuk along the bustling Chinatown or take a long tail boat through floating markets. Food is another Bangkok highlight, from local dishes served at humble street stalls to haute cuisine at romantic rooftop restaurants.

a) Climate

The weather in Bangkok is dominated by a tropical monsoon climate. As Bangkok holds claim to being the hottest city in the world, expect daytime temperatures to be in excess of 30 degrees centigrade throughout the year.

Kindly note the current haze and air pollution in Bangkok; we strongly encourage you to prepare and bring along your own mask. You can monitor the situation via <https://aqicn.org/city/bangkok/>

b) Currency

The currency of Thailand is the Thai baht. The baht comes in the following denominations: Bank notes: 1,000, 500, 100, 50 and 20. Coins: 10, 5, 2, 1. Use the currency converter (www.xe.com/currencyconverter) to determine the estimated value of your own local currency based on daily exchange rates. As of February 2019, it is approximately USD 1 to THB 31.

c) Transport

Please make your own ground transfer arrangement.

Distance from Suvarnabhumi Airport (BKK) to Bangkok Marriott Marquis Queen's Park is about 30km, travel time is between 30-50min, depending on the traffic condition. Public taxi by metre costs about THB300-400.

Distance from Don Muang Airport (DMK) to Bangkok Marriott Marquis Queen's Park is about 23km, travel time is between 20-40min, depending on the traffic condition. Public taxi by metre costs about THB250-350.

d) Electricity

Thailand uses a two pin plug socket. The standard voltage is 220V.



e) Local SIM Cards

Local SIM cards and top-up cards are available for purchase at all major convenience stores.

f) Etiquette

Thais are generally very understanding and hospitable, but there are some important taboos and social conventions.

- Monarchy: It is a criminal offence to disrespect the royal family; treat objects depicting the king (like money) with respect.

- Temples: Wear clothing that covers to your knees and elbows. Remove all footwear before entering. Sit with your feet tucked behind you, so they are not facing the Buddha image. Women should never touch a monk or a monk's belongings; step out of the way on footpaths and don't sit next to them on public transport.
